Due respect was afforded to all fallen Australian, New Zealand and Turkish soldiers. Adam Burke attended the service and spoke of his service history as a soldier in the Australian Army. Students not only led the service with the laying of the wreath, the Ode and the Last Post but also via prayers and poems in Maori, a Turkish letter as written by Turkish leader, Mustafa Ataturk, and the National Anthems of Australia, New Zealand and Turkey.
